WHY THIS LESSON?

- 1. There are Israelites who do not believe that Jesus is the correct name of the Messiah
- 2. There are also those who believe that Jesus is not our Messiah, but, for some, a white man who the europeans convinced us is God
- 3. The enemy of our souls has WEAPONIZED this against us so that we will be confused about using the name of Jesus.
- 4. So that you can know the history, understand the arguments and be equipped to give an answer for what you believe.

TRANSLATION VS TRANSLITERATION

A translation tells you the meaning of words in another language. A transliteration doesn't tell you the meaning of the words, but it helps you pronounce them. Transliteration changes the letters from one alphabet or language into the corresponding, similar-sounding characters of another alphabet.

- [1] The letter didn't exist during the time of Christ
- [2] It was originally associated with the letter "I"
- [3] It originally made the sound of the letter "Y" as in "Hallelujah"
